Fourth of July Street Closures

During the Fourth of July celebration, watch out for streets around Pacific Palisades closed for various activities, such as the Will Rogers 5K/10K, the Parade and the fireworks.

RACE CLOSURES: Will

Rogers 5K/10K race closures will start at 7 a.m. The Huntington Palisades neighborhood including Alma Real Drive, Corona del Mar Toyopa Drive and Pampas Ricas will be closed. Drummond St. from Toyopa to Chautauqua; Ocampo from Drummond to Alma Real will also be shut down. Sunset Boulevard from Amalfi Drive to Monument Street will be closed in both directions. Chautauqua Boulevard north of Sunset until Drummond and Drummond from Chautauqua to Toyopa will also be closed. The roads will reopen after the race course is closed about 11 a.m.

PARADE CLOSURES: The

parade route and staging areas, which include Via de la Paz, Sunset, Drummond Street, Toyopa, La Cruz Drive and Alma Real, will close at 1:30 p.m. or possibly earlier and will not reopen until after the parade route is cleared. Estimated reopening is 4 p.m.

CONCERT/FIREWORKS

CLOSURES: Westbound Bowdoin Street, in front of Palisades **High School**, will be closed at noon (or before, depending on the arrival of the fireworks) and there will be no vehicle access from Temescal Canyon Road to the stadium. The eastbound lane of Bowdoin will close at 4 p.m. and not reopen until after the fireworks show. North and Southbound Temescal Canyon Road will close shortly before 9 p.m. to Palisades-bound traffic (no turns off Pacific Coast Highway).

Palisades-Will Rogers 5/10k Run

One of the Palisades' proudest holiday traditions continues next Monday morning at the Palisades Recreation Center, where friends, neighbors, family members, classmates and business associates of all ages will mingle for the 39th annual Palisades-Will Rogers 5/10K Run.

ORIGIN

Considered to be one of the toughest road courses in California, the 10K race was founded in 1978 by Brian Shea, Chris Carlson and Bill Klein, members of a local early-morning jogging group called the Ridge Runners. Shea and Carlson came up with the idea of the race while picnicking on the grass on San Vicente after running the Brentwood 10K on Memorial Day in 1977. They mapped out a course, cut through red tape to get the needed City and state permits and in 1978 the Palisades-Will Rogers 10K was born.

Drew Mearns, 25-year-old law student from Virginia who was in town to visit his sister, won the inaugural race and since then Shea has watched his brainchild grow in prestige and popularity. The event's director since its inception. Shea is tickled that local runners come back year after year to challenge the switchbacks of Will Rogers State Historic Park in the 10K. In 1986, the 5K course became part of the race and a half-mile Kids' Fun Run was added 10 years later.

PARADE

course now have that opportunity after the race committee lengthened the route last year to eliminate the congestion that can occur at the Sunset Boulevard and Drummond Street in-

tersection. The change increased the distance by 427 feet, making it a full 3.1 miles.

The start and finish lines and splits for miles one, two and three are in the same locations as they have always been. Course veterans, however, will notice that the separation of 5K and 10K runners now occurs on northbound Toyopa (5K keeping left, 10K keeping right), just prior to making the right turn onto Drummond.

Once at Sunset, 5K runners now turn left onto Sunset, hugging the left (eastbound) curb, while 10K runners turn right on Sunset and con-

tinue the route to Will Rogers and back.

At Carey Street, 5K runners now turn left and proceed to Toyopa, where they again turn left and run to a U-turn point on


Toyopa Drive (before reaching Drummond), then return on the opposite side of Toyopa to the finish. Red traffic cones will be placed where required to maintain the separation of the 5K and 10K races.

RACE RECORDS

In 1983, Russell Edmonds of New Zealand set the still-standing men's 10K race record of 29:46 and no one has broken the 30-minute barrier since.

Katie Dunsmuir, who had just graduated from Palisades High, set the women's record of 35:09. Dunsmuir, a cross country and track star for the Dolphins, had won the previous year and would go on to win four straight times (1992-95) for a total of six, including four of the top 10 fastest times ever among females. Dunsmuir, who ran for the Santa Monica Track Club, had set the Mt. SAC Invi-

tational 5K record and was second in the junior women's 5K race at the 1982 national cross country championships in New Jersey.

Peter Gilmore, who grew up on Via de la Paz, set the men's 5K record of 14:10 in 2003 and the closest anyone has come to breaking it was Gilmore himself, who clocked 14:12 the very next year. In fact, in the 30 years the 5K has been run, only five people have won in under 15 minutes and only Gilmore (who did it seven times) has done so more than once.

Annetta Luevano set the women's 5K record of 16:29 in 1995. The second-fastest time was run two years earlier by Tania Fischer, two-time winner of the Pacific Palisades Tur**key Trot** and currently the head track coach at Santa Monica High.

RACE KING

Less than two months after winning the Palisadian-Post Cup Award as the outstanding senior athlete at Pali High,

Gilmore won the 5K for the first time in 1995, foretelling his rise as an elite marathon runner. Gilmore, who went on to a successful track career at UC Berkeley, won the 5K seven more times and still owns the five fastest times and six of the top 10 fastest times in Will Rogers history.

Gilmore had ambitions of making the Olympics in the marathon and became one of the United States' best at that distance. In 2006 he not only won his last Will Rogers 5K, but was also the top American finisher at the New York Marathon (clocking 2:13:13). The following year he was the top American finisher in Boston and in 2008 he set the course record at the Surf City USA Half Marathon (clocking 1:05:53).

Two summers ago Gilmore was back in the Palisades visiting his parents, Ed and Rita, and decided to give the 10K a try for the first time. He finished sixth overall and second in the 35-39 age group in 35:56. Last year, he returned at the age of 38 to give the revised 5K course a try and was fourth overall and first in his age group in 16:55.


RACE QUEEN

While Gilmore remains the 5K master, no one has more overall victories (11) than fellow Palisadian Kara Barnard. A 1996 Pali High graduate, she helped the Dolphins win the City Section girls cross country championship in 1994 and went on to run cross country and track at UCLA.

Barnard has won the 5K five times (with three of the 10 best women's times) and the 10K six times, including a 35:24 effort in 2004 that remains the third fastest in race history. She and Gilmore swept the 5K races four times (1997-99, 2003) and Barnard won three straight 10Ks from 2010-12 to match Dunsmuir's total of six.


FAMILIAR FACES

No one knows the course better than Lawrence Meyer and Paul Junger. Each has run the 10K every year since it started in 1978. The 74-year-old Junger, who lives in West LA, clocked 1:31:54 last summer (Continued on page 16)

while the 68-year-old Meyer, who lives in Glendale, finished in 1:27:52. They still wear their t-shirts from the inaugural race.

Runners representing the "Fluffy Bunnies," a Santa Monica-based track club sponsored by Nike, have fared well at Will Rogers with numerous wins and top three finishes in the 10K. Tyson Sacco and Kevin Purcell have each snapped the tape twice. David Olds has won the 5K and 10K and teammate Andrew Atkeson has won the 5K. Nate Bowen of Redwood City has won the 10K (6.2 miles) four times.

Pilates and fitness instructor Therese Fricke won the 5K three times (2005, 2009, 2011) while Aine Lynam (1989-90) and Jenna Dee (2006-07) each won it back-to-back.

Lifelong Palisadian David Greifinger was 22 years old when he became the first local runner to win the 10K in 1979 and was 29 when he won the inaugural 5K race in 1986. Last year, Palisadian John Holcomb, who has run the race about 20 times, finished first in his division in 19:32-a 6:18

pace—at 61 years of age. His best time was 16:48 when he was "only" 48.

REIGNING CHAMPS

Tonny Okello won in 32:55 to become only the fourth male in race history to repeat in the 10K and the first since Kevin Koeper won it back-to-back in 2005 and 2006. Okello (who won in 31:19 the year before) was 11 seconds ahead of runner-up Brady O'Bryan, the 2013 winner.

The women's 10K winner

was 48-year-old ex-triathlete Susanne McNeil Eng (40:33), who was elated to finally break the tape after several top five finishes.

Former Pali High cross country and truck runner Drake Johnston (now at Villanova) won the men's 5K in 15:56, followed by Loyola High distance runner Charlie Sherman (16:18) and 2000 winner Jeff Tomlinson (16:25), who was runner-up in 2014. Johnston was fifth in 17:05 in 2014.

How to Protect Your Pet During Fourth Festivities

While putting the finishing touches on your Fourth of July plans, take a moment to consider your pets.

Along with barbecues and day at the beach, no July holiday celebration would be complete without a dazzling fireworks display.

Unfortunately, our fourlegged friends are a lot more sensitive to the noise, flashes and burning smell of pyrotechnic celebrations. Because of this, the American Humane Association reports that July 5 is the busiest day of the year for animal shelters due to the volume of pets that panicked and fled in response to July 4 festivities, winding up lost, injured or killed.

The following tips can help make your holiday more pet-friendly.

1. Keep pets at home rather than bringing them to the fire-

works show or neighborhood barbecue. Dogs are more sensitive to the loud noise and flashing light of fireworks, so it's better to keep them in the house than in the yard. Even pets that are normally outdoors may try to break a restraint or jump a fence to find safety.

- **2.** If you are hosting, be attentive to your pet's temperament throughout the festivities. Place notes on your gates reminding your guests to keep the dog in the yard. When it comes time for the fireworks display, be sure your pets are safely sheltered. Avoid feeding your animals scraps from the grill and cover all alcoholic drinks.
- **3.** If away from home, loud festivities paired with your absence are likely to make your pet anxious, so create a soothing atmosphere. Give your pet plenty of attention and exercise early in the day so she is less inclined to be restless later in the

day. When you depart, leave the blinds down and radio or TV on. If your pet is crate trained, consider keeping him in a crate covered with a blanket.

- **4.** Be sure all pets, even indoor-only animals, are microchipped and have proper identification. Pets can become so frightened during fireworks displays they may take desperate measures to escape the noise. If you have horses, you might consider marking a breakaway halter with your contact information and leaving it on your
- **5.** If you know fireworks scare your dog, consult your veterinarian. There are medications and techniques available to help alleviate your pet's
- **6.** Do not put glow jewelry on your pets, or allow them to play with it. Although the luminescent substance in these products is not highly toxic, it still may cause excessive drooling and gastrointestinal irritation if ingested.
- **7.** Many human products can be dangerous to animals. Avoid spraying your pet with insect repellent that contains DEET, which can cause neurological problems. Citronella candles, insect coils and tiki torch oil products can also be

toxic. If sunscreen is ingested, it may lead to drooling, vomiting, diarrhea, excessive thirst and lethargy.

8. After the celebrations.

check your yard for fireworks debris before allowing pets outside to play or relax. Even if you didn't set off any fireworks yourself, debris can make its way into your yard.






LAFD Fireworks Precautions

The Los Angeles Fire Department (LAFD) reminds Pacific Palisades residents that all fireworks are illegal within city limits. Captain Dan Rodriguez of LAFD Station 69 suggests Palisadians attend professional firework shows instead of acquiring their own. The captain said smaller fireworks actually tend to cause more damage and warned likely victims.

residents to be wary of sparklers. Rodriguez said children often get hurt with the seemingly harmless holiday favors.

My Safe LA issued five reasons to leave the fireworks to professionals:

- **1.** It's not you that will be hurt, but someone you know.
- **2.** Children are the most



- **4.** You aren't a professional pyro-technician.
- 5. Possession and/or use of fireworks within Los Angeles is a violation of the Health and Safety Code. Have you modeled your new orange jumpsuit for the wife yet?

"Even 'safe and sane' fireworks are outlawed in the city of Los Angeles," said Erik Scott, LAFD spokesperson. "They are all dangerous. Don't become a statistic."

Since several outlying communities still offer "safe and sane" fireworks, the LAFD reminds everyone that before running out to purchase fireworks of any kind, keep in mind:

The risk of fireworks injury was two-and-a-half times as high for children ages five to nine or 10 to 14 as for the general population.

Sparklers, fountains and novelties alone accounted for 36 percent of the emergency room fireworks injuries in recent years.

Scott also reminds residents who own pets to keep them safe during fireworks. The loud noises and fiery blasts associated with pyrotechnics can be traumatic for most animals, causing

stress that can take the form of shivering, cowering, destructive chewing rampages or animals running away to escape.

Officials recommend leaving pets at home during the fireworks, preferably in a quiet room with no windows and remove any items your pet could destroy.




